Gov's \$5B 1st Step:

- \$2.8 billion to help people and fund the services they need to weather the crisis
- \$2.2 billion to businesses and help them recover after the outbreak.



Provincial Financial Support

Tax Remittance Deferrals

The provincial government is extending tax filing and payment deadlines to September 30th, 2020, including:

- Employee Health Tax (EHT)
- Provincial Sales Tax (PST)
- Motor Fuel Taxes
- Tobacco Tax
- Municipal & Regional District Tax
- Carbon Tax



Other Provincial Financial Support

- Commercial, light and major industrial property classes (Classes 4-6) will see a 50% cut to provincial school tax providing \$500 million in immediate relief for business that own their property and allowing commercial landlords to immediately pass savings on to their tenants in triple-net leases.
- The new PST for e-commerce and sweetened beverages has been deferred and will be reviewed by Sept. 30, 2020.
- The scheduled increase of carbon tax has been postponed
- The Province has dedicated \$1.5 billion for economic recovery

Provincial Support for Employees

- BC Emergency Benefit for Workers provides a one-time \$1,000 payment for people who lost income
- A <u>one-time enhancement</u> to the <u>climate action tax credit</u> will be paid in July 2020 for moderate to low-income families
- Support for renters and landlords include a new temporary rental supplement, halting evictions and freezing rents.
- Rental supplements are also available through BC Housing.

Crown Corp Support

- ICBC is offering payment plan deferrals for up to 90 days with no penalties.
- BC Hydro: Customers can:
 - <u>defer payments</u> or arrange flexible payment plans with no penalty (through the <u>COVID-19 Customer Assistance Program</u>)
 Call 1 800 BCHYDRO (1 800 224 9376)
 - access grants through Customer Crisis Fund (CCF),
 - receive three months of free credit to help pay their hydro bills through the COVID-19 Relief Fund.
- FortisBC is waiving late payment fees and ensuring no customer is disconnected and will discuss flexible payment options.
- WorkSafeBC will be allowing employers to defer payment of their Q1 2020 payments by three months.
